

CLUB CODE OF CONDUCT AT ALL GVSA and MSYSA SANCTIONED SOCCER GAMES.

While GVSA will deal with reported misconduct, clubs also have a role to play in educating its membership as to what is – and what isn't – acceptable behavior and take action when this code is broken.

We suggest that each club appoint a compliance officer, which could be a current board member that will oversee the "Respect Code of Conducts" (RCOC) of the club and their implementation consistent with the new Respect Campaign from GVSA.

Each RCOC explains what action can and will be taken if the Code of Conduct is broken.

Each GVSA club has three main responsibilities relating to the GVSA Respect Campaign:

- To ensure everyone within the club (club members), whatever their role, has read, agreed and signed up to their relevant Code – and understands the actions which could be taken if Codes are broken. The inclusion of Codes into the registration process of club members ensures that all playing members can be made aware of their responsibilities at the point of joining the club.
- 2. To collect and retain the Codes so that they can be referred back to, if an individual's behavior becomes unacceptable.
- 3. To deal fairly and consistently with anyone who breaks this RCOC agreement.

If your club hasn't used Codes of Conduct before – or has Codes without consequences – this needs discussion, so your members understand how the RCOC work and what their responsibilities are.

#### Clubs which already have Codes of Conduct:

If you already have your own club Codes of Conduct, it is advised that you adopt the new Respect Codes of Conduct (RCOC) or revise your existing codes to include any elements you may have missed.

Potential measures that a club can take against its members include but not limited to;

- Apologize to teammates, the other team, referee, team manager or coach.
- Receive a warning from the coach.
- Receive a verbal/written warning from the club board.



COACH CODE OF CONDUCT AT ALL GVSA and MSYSA SANCTIONED SOCCER GAMES.

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behavior in the game. One of the biggest issues within GVSA is the behavior in and around the game. This included the abuse of match officials and the unacceptable behavior of over competitive parents, spectators and coaches on the sideline.

We ask our coaches to play their part and observe GVSA's Respect Code of Conduct in everything they do. Therefore we ask you to take the following pledge:

#### On and off the field, I will:

- Show respect to others involved in the game including match officials, opposition players, coaches, managers, officials and spectators.
- Adhere to the laws and spirit of the game.
- 3. Promote Fair Play and high standards of behavior.
- 4. Always respect the match official's decision.
- 5. Consistently display high standards of behavior and appearance.
- 6. Never enter the field of play without the referee's permission.
- 7. Never engage in public criticism of the match officials.
- 8. Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behavior.
- Always seek ways of increasing professional development and continuing coaching education.

#### When working with players, I will:

- Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything, including winning.
- 2. Explain exactly what I expect of players and what they can expect from me.
- Ensure all parents/guardians of all players under the age of 18 understand these expectations.
- 4. Never engage in or tolerate any form of bullying.

## Respect – A Game We All Must Play

REFEREE CODE OF CONDUCT AT ALL GVSA and MSYSA SANCTIONED SOCCER GAMES.

Match officials all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behavior in every game whether they are officiating a match or not. The behavior of match officials has an impact, directly and indirectly, on the conduct of everyone involved in the game both on the field and on the sidelines.

Officials are expected to play their part and observe GVSA's below Respect Code of Conduct at all times.

#### Officials will always strive to:

- Be honest and completely impartial at all times.
- Be timely and professional in appearance, dress and manner at all times.
- Apply the "Laws of the Game" and competition rules fairly and consistently and make sure to have
  read and understood the published game day procedures for the game that they are officiating.
- Manage the game in a positive, calm and confident manner.
- · Deal with all instances of violence, aggression, unsporting behavior, foul play and other misconduct.
- Never tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behavior from players, spectators, coaches, team and other match officials.
- Support other match official colleagues at all times.
- Set a positive personal example by promoting good behavior and showing respect to everyone involved in the game.
- Communicate with the players and encourage Fair Play. A special effort will be made to work and
   communicate with team captain(s) to maintain match control and game flow.
- Respond in a clear, calm and confident manner to any appropriate request for information or clarification by the team captains.
- Prepare physically and mentally for every match that you commit to officiate.
- Complete and submit, accurate and concise reports within the time limit required for games in which you
  officiate.

I understand that if I do not follow this Respect Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, league, MSYSA or the MRC:

I may be required:

- To attend a USSF or MSYSA sponsored education course or view training video's.
- To meet with a USSF Referee Official, Instructor, Assessor or GVSOA Administrator to review my
  performance and/or plan to take corrective action.


